10:00 AM

Abbreviated services

11:00 AM

Break into discussion groups:

"Afflicting our souls - is skipping canteen for 10 days enough?"

"Was Abraham really gonna sacrifice Isaac, or was he just off his meds?"

"The Book of Life - how can I check if my name is in it?"

12:30 PM

Catered lunch in the mess hall, provided by Wheelhouse

1:30 - 2:30 PM

Rest hour (see Day 1 for explanation)

Free time, all areas open

<u>5:30 PM</u>

Flag lowering, then everybody heads home
