SYNOPSIS

Camelot is an imaginary place. It is the thirteenth century.

Arthur, who is betrothed to Guinevere, is in a dilemma. She is also quite apprehensive of the forthcoming marriage.

Merlin, the court magician, foresees the future as a bright one and Arthur forms the famed round table.

The entire court gather at the May festival to greet Guinevere. Lancelot du Lac, the Frenchman and first at the round table is also presented. He, however fails to make a good impression so he finds himself in disfavor with everyone. Guinevere then chides Sagamore, Lionel and Dinadin to challenge the Frenchman at the jousts.

The tournament begins. The three knights are felled by Lancelot, Dinadin mortally. Lancelot's great faith revives the knight and he gains the favor of the court and especially Guinevere. She confesses her love, but because he is a man of chivalry and honor, he must depart from the court.

All of Camelot rejoice in the coronation of Arthur and Guinevere and the long life of Camelot.
