

1971 OLYMPIC GAMES Waypaca, Wisconsin United States of America

9:30 OPENING CEREMONIES: The nations will assemble on the athletic field and led by flag bearers, they will march single file down to the waterfront. The flags will be unfurled, the torch will be lighted, the oath will be taken, and the games will begin.

OLYMPIC OATH: We swear to take part in the Olympic Games in loyal competition, respecting the regulations which govern them, and desirous of participating with the true spirit of sportsmanship for the honor of our country and the glory of sport.

BASKETBALL: Each nation is to have a four man basketball team. Games will be ten minutes (half-court) and each nation will play three games (opponents decided by lot). Points will be awarded according to won-lost record. Athletes "AA" must play; athletes "BC" and "C" are ineligible.

FIELD SPORTS: Each nation is to have an eight man team to compete in each of three field sports. Teams will compete in soccer, rugby, and flickerball (one game each). Points will be awarded according to won-lost record. Athletes "AA" are ineligible.

LINE SOCCER: Each nation is to have a four man line soccer team. All eight nations will compete in a single game of fifty minutes. Athletes "AA" and "A" and "AB" are ineligible.

11:30 REGULAR PENTATHLON: Each nation is to have one man to compete in the following events: riflery, archery, 600 yard run, 30 yard freestyle swim, and canoeing. Athletes "AA" and "AB" are eligible.

TRACK PENTATHLON: Each nation is to have one man in each of the following events (one man for all five): 50 yard dash, 300 yard run, high jump, long jump, and ball throw. Athletes "AA" and "A" and "AB" are eligible.

SINGLES ROWING: Each nation will supply a single rower. All races will be between two nations for time.

CANOEING: Each nation will supply two paddlers. All eight nations will race at once (across both lakes and back).

PLAYAK: Each nation will supply one man for a timed race around sunken bouys.

MARATHON RELAY: Each nation is to have a five man team to run 300 yards each. All races will be between two nations for time.

GO CARTING: Each nation is to have two men to race five laps for time. Athletes "BC" and "C" are eligible.

TENNIS: Each nation is to have two men to play doubles tennis in a double elimination tournament. Athletes "C" are ineligible.

GOLF: Each nation is to have two men to play nine holes for a total combined score. Athletes "C" are ineligible.

2:00 ARCHERY: Each nation is to have a three man team to shoot one target of six arrows. Points distributed according to team totals.

RIFLERY: Each nation is to have a four man rifle team. Points will be distributed according to team totals.

(no duplication between archery - riflery - high jump)

- 3:00 TRACK MEET: Each nation is divided into three overlapping divisions: 1) AA-A-AB 2) AB-B-BC 3) BC-C. Each nation is to have one man (per division) in each of the following events: 50 yard dash, 220 yard run, long jump, high jump, and ball throw.
- 4:00 SWIM MEET: Each nation is to supply one man for the breaststroke, backstroke, and freestyle. Each team also supplies three men for a medely relay. No duplication in these events. This will be followed by an all nation relay with all able bodied swimmers.
- 7:00 TUG O' WAR: All nation double elimination competition.

 SHUTTLE RELAY: All nation relay on athletic field--four nations at once for time.

DUPLICATION RULES

- 10:00 All extra men add one sub to the field sports team.
- 11:30 Teams with 16 players may duplicate one man in single rowing and in playak.
 - 3:00 Extra players may be entered in any event and the best performance will be counted as the team's only performance.
