

1973 OLYMPICS Waupaca, Wisconsin

FRIDAY

9:30 OPENING CEREMONIES: Led by a single flag bearer, the nations will march from the athletic fields to the waterfront. An introduction to the games will be presented by the Greek God Zeus and the oath of Olympic competition will be administered. The flags will be unfurled, the torch will be lighted and the 36 hours of Olympic competition will begin.

OLYMPIC OATH: We swear to take part in the Olympic games in loyal competition, respecting the regulations which gowrn the, and desirous of participating with the true spirit of sportsmanship for the honor of our country and the glory of sport.

- 10:00 MARATHON CANOE COMPETITION: Following the opening ceremonies, two representatives from each nation will report to the ski dock. All nations will observe from the top of the waterfront as the participants cover the course of apx. 3/4 mile. See duplication instructions. Open to all athletes.
- 10:30 REGULAR PENTATHLON: One boy to enter the following combination of events: riflery, archery, 600 yard run, 30 yard freestyle swim, and singles canoeing. Athletes AA and A and AB are eligible. Others must obtain special permission.

TRACK PENTATHLON: One boy to enter the following combination of events: 50 yard dash, 300 yard run, high jump, long jump, and ball throw. Athletes AA and A and AB are eligible. Others must obtain special permisssion.

TENNIS: Each nation enters one two-man tennis team to compete in the pre-liminary rounds of an elimination tournament. The matches will be held during the morning and again in the evening. (See duplication instructions). Athletes BC and C are ineligible.

GOLF: Each nation enters one two-man golf team to compete in a nine hole total team score tournament. Athletes BC and C are ineligible.

BOATING: Each nation enters two or three boys for boating competition (see duplication instructions). The events are: doubles canceing, singles rowing and playak. Open to all athletes.

RIFLERY - JR TEAM COMPETITION: Two boys from each nation for a total team score match. Open only to athletes B and BC and C.

ARCHERY - JR TEAM COMPETITION. Two boys from each nation for a total team score match. Open only to athletes B and BC and C.

MARATHON RELAY: Five boys from each nation to run 300 yards each. The boys will then compete in one of the following two events: MINI-BIKES (two boys for total time) and TRI-SKILL RELAYS (three boys in running, jumping and throwing events). AA and A ineligible.

2:15 SPLIT SWIM MEET & FIELD SPORTS COMPETITION: Group A composed of four nations will report to the waterfront for swimming time trials as group B plays their scheduled games in Basketball, Field Sports and Hockey. At 3:45 the nations on the waterfront will report for their scheduled games, and group B will report to the waterfront for swimming time trials. (Consult Pairings for group listings).

BASKETBALL: Each nation is to enter one four man squad to compete in four scheduled games during the Friday afternoon pre-liminary rounds of an elimination tournament. The Friday games will consist of three half-court games and one full-court game. Half court games lasting 12 minutes and full court games lasting 15 minutes running time. All AA athletes must compete in basketball unless given special permission to participate in field sports. Athletes BC and C must secure special permission to participate. All others are eligible.

FIELD SPORTS: Each nation enters 8 or 9 boys (see duplication instructions) to compete in three scheduled Friday afternoon games. The final games will be held Saturday afternoon. The Friday games consist of two rugby and one soccer game each lasting apx 20 minutes. Athletes AA with special permission designated Thursday evening will be eligible to participate.

HOCKEY: Each nation enters a five man hockey team to compete in pre-liminary matches Friday afternoon and final games Saturday afternoon. The Friday games consist of three 20 minute games. Athletes AA and A and AB are ineligible. No exceptions.

SWIMMING AND PLAYAK COMPETITION: Each nation enters six boys in the following events: freestyle, backstroke, breaststroke, and medely. No duplication between swimming events and playak or between individual and medely events. Each nation enters eight boys for playak relays. All races are open to all athletes. Fourteen different boys must compete. Following the swimming competition and the completion of the playak relays, all able-bodied swimmers from each nation will compete in the giant all nation swim.

7:00 WRESTLING: Each nation is to enter 3 wrestlers (only one per weight classification) in any three of the following groups: 68 lbs and under, 69-80, 81-92, 93-104, 105-116, 117-128. (See duplication instructions). Boys will weigh in before the matches.

TENNIS FINAIS: The semi-finals and finals of the tennis tournament will be held during the wrestling competition. Consult duplication instructions for substitution of tennis players who have not advanced to the final rounds of the tournament.

ARCHERY: Each nation will enter a three man archery team for both total team and individual scoring honors. Open to all Athletes.

JR BASKETBALL: Each nation enters a three-man Jr. Basketball team to compete in an elimination tournament. Open only to athletes B and BC and C.

- 8:30 STEEPLECHASE: One boy from each nation to compete in a hurdling race covering a course of apx 200 yards. See duplication instructions. All nations will observe from the athletic fields. Open to all athletes.
- 8:45 CLOSING CEREMONIES: All nations will assemble at the horseshoe for a campfire. Each nation is responsible for a one minute presentation concerning the Olympics, competition, sportsmanship, or camp in general. The three most significant presentations will receive bronze, silver and gold medals.

SATURDAY

- 9:30 OPENING CEREMONIES: The second day of Olympics will begin with a second address at the waterfront concerning the background of the international games and their meaning in today's world.
- 10:00 VOLLEYBALL: Each nation enters 9 or 10 boys to compete in a tournament of scheduled games. See duplication instructions. Athletes C are ineligible. Athletes BC must be given special permission.

RIFLERY: Each nation will enter a three man rifle team for both total team and individual scoring honors. Open to all athletes.

LINE_SOCCER: Each nation will enter 5 boys in a line-soccer game. Athletes AA and A and AB are absolutely ineligible. B athletes must secure special permission. Teams are to be composed almost exclusively of BC and C athletes.

- 11:30 ALL NATION MARATHON: Each nation competes in a giant marathon of running and canoeing. Eight boys will canoe, five boys will run 440 yards each, five boys will run 100 yards each. See duplication instructions.
 - 2:15 TEAM SPORTS CHAMPIONSHIPS: The final rounds of the elimination tournaments in Basketball, Field Sports and Hockey will be played during a 75 minute period Saturday afternoon. The pairings will be based on the results of the Friday games.
 - 3:30 TRACK COMPETITION: Each nation is divided into three overlapping divisions: A) AA-A-AB B) AB-B-BC C) BC-C. Each nation enters one man from the "A" division in each of the following: High Jump, Shot Put, Long Jump, 220 yard dash, 600 yard run, Ball Throw, and 2 men in the 50 yard dash (a total of eight). One man from the

"B" division in each of the following: High Jump, Long Jump, 220 yard dash, 600 yard run, Ball Throw, and 2 men in the 50 yard dash (a total of 7). One man from the "C" division in each of the following: Long Jump, 220 yard dash, Ball Throw, and 2 men in the 50 yard dash (a total of 5). Consult duplication rules carefully before completing line-ups.

- 7:00 SHUTTLE RELAY: All nation relay for time. Each boy runs 50 yards.
- 8:00 TUG O' WAR: All nations compete in an elimination tug tournament on the athletic fields.
- 9:00 CLOSING CEREMONIES: The final medal presentations and the final standings will be announced. A closing address will be given, the flags will be unfurled, and the games will close for 1973.

DUPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

FRIDAY

· North

- 10:00 Any two from each nation may compete in the marathen cance competition. It is separate from the following events at 10:30.
- 10:30 Teams with 17 will enter 2 men in the boating competition (each man competiting in two events). Teams with 18 will enter 3. Teams with 16 must secure special permission for a duplication in another area.
 - 2:15 Teams with 17 will compete with only 8 in Field Sports. Opponents will sub one if they have nine players. Teams with 18 will compete with nine players. Teams with 16 must secure special permission to play with less than the required number.
 - 7:00 No duplication between wrestling and tennis. Tennis players who do not advance to the final matches and will then be available in the evening may be substituted in events other than wrestling. Special permission must be granted. (In advance).
 - 8:30 Any one boy may compete in the steeplechase. It is separate from the preceding events.

SATURDAY

- 10:00 Teams with 17 will play with 9 boys in Volleyball. Teams with 18 will play with 10. Teams with 16 must secure special permission to make another substitution.
 - 3:30 No team shall enter any boy in three track events. A boy may be duplicated only if there is not enough members of his division to cover the events. All duplications must be approved. No boy can compete in two different divisions. Extra boys should be entered in any event for which they qualify—only the best performance per team per division will be recorded.
